PROGRAM:



Dottie Metcalf - Executive Director

Unfortunately we lost power at the Hukiau right before Dottie Metcalf gave her presentation so she was unable to show us her PowerPoint. However she did a great job of “winging it” and told us about the many great resources available in Fallbrook and surrounding areas for seniors. There are 3 major programs:

Care Advocate Program- 2 care advocates- Referral for new widow or widower 7000 seniors in Fallbrook Advocate can go to home and assess situation. Served over 337 seniors last year at no charge. Grant from Fallbrook Hospital District to help continue program.

Care Van-Rolling billboard Advertisements on van pay for van, maintenance, van drivers and gas, Takes seniors to grocery stores, doctors, hair appointments senior center, senior club. Covers area of Fallbrook, Rainbow, De Luz and Bonsall . Cost for advertising is \$1200 for medallion on body of vehicle, back mount \$1500, and top is \$2000 Run Monday thru Friday 9-5.

Senior Adult Day-care Center- Program for seniors and Adults who are memory impaired or fragile. Drop off for half or full day and have program centered for adults \$30 for half day 4 hours and \$60 for full day. Can have care van pick them up and drop them off

Dottie also told us about **Senior Net** which is a free computer workshop for seniors 50 and over. They will fix your computer for free if able.

She said that grants and donations are vital to the existence of programs and they are currently running at a deficit. They do various fundraisers including Paws in the Park which was last April. They had over 100 dogs, 300 people and 40 vendors. The on November 6th they will be having “ Dinner with the Doc’s which is 25-30 of our finest doctors including dentists and eye doctors. The event will be held a Pala Casino. There will also be a silent auction with some great items. And we were all invited to the Summer Breeze Open House on July 27th at the Adult Day Care Center located at 325 W. Alvarado in Fallbrook. Bill Horn will have a representative there.



Lastly Dottie stressed that this is no longer the Fallbrook Health Care Foundation. It is very different and a much improved organization since its inception 30 years ago.
